With a 3.7 GPA, the honors student was active in numerous school and club activities, including judo, wresting, track and field, paddling and Polynesian Dance Club. Thompson served as the team captain and strength of the high school swimming team while his paddling coach credited this youth as a dedicated and consistent paddler "who has grown into an exceptional young man and inspiring team leader."

Jocelyn Conae is the inaugural recipient of KCC's new Mary MacCheyne Humanitarian Achievement Scholarship. She will study science/EMT at UH-Manoa. "Jocelyn is graduating with academic honors, maintaining a remarkable 3.9 GPA while pursuing advanced courses in the University of Hawai'i's Running Start program by completing college level classes while still in high school," noted one of her teachers.
