Board News

On October 18, Keauhou Canoe Club held a Special Meeting to vote on adding online voting to the bylaws. The motion did not pass (83-17).

At the October 19 board meeting, the Board addressed rising capital expenses, such as canoe and halau maintenance. To offset costs, adult dues for 2026 will increase 8%, from \$130 to \$140 per year. This does not affect registration fees for keiki, youth, or 80+ members, which remain mid-range compared to other clubs.

Because the Kailua Pier mooring blocks for race flags were found to harm coral, there have been no regattas in Kailua-Kona for two years. A new committee is now restoring the flags, benefiting all Western racers and local schools. The three home clubs: Keauhou, Kai'Opua, and Kai'Ehitu will each contribute about \$17,000 toward the project.
